



Tips For Students

Attend **all** class meetings

- A. You cannot learn if you are absent from class.
- B. Each class you miss makes it easier to miss another, until you miss so many that you fail the course.
- C. You do not get your money's worth out of class if you do not attend.
- D. Professors usually take a large percent of their test questions from their class lectures.
- E. Attendance can count toward your grade.

Complete all written assignments ahead of time so that you have an opportunity to go over them with your tutor.

Remember that professors grade an assignment both on its content and its appearance, i.e., typing, spelling, punctuation, and grammar.

***Be sure to follow the directions given for an assignment*.**

Be sure to turn in your assignments on their due dates.

Get to know your professor and some of your classmates.

Ask questions in class.

Be sure to read and keep organized all handouts your professor gives you, particularly the course syllabus, and **SAVE THEM !**

Remember to date each page of your notebook for each class lecture.

Make study outlines from your homework readings.

Write down questions, confusions, difficulties, problems and bring them to class and/or tutoring sessions.

If a professor gives you an example of how an assignment should be written/completed, be sure to do your assignment in the same manner; **DO NOT MAKE UP YOUR OWN FORMAT!**

If you have any questions or concerns about an assignment, lecture, or chapter, then be sure to get assistance from a tutor in the Academic Achievement Center.

Remember those students who succeed are those who get assistance if they have problems.
