CLC History



The Curriculum Leadership Center (CLC) at Bridgewater State University evolved from the Southeast Massachusetts School/College Consortium which was established in 1987 by representatives from the University and several area school systems. As the Consortium's membership grew, the need for a regional center for curriculum leaders was evident. The Consortium's leadership proposed the establishment of the CLC in 1991 and a grant from the New England Association of Schools and Colleges assisted in its development.

The CLC began in September, 1992, with the Southeast School/College Consortium which included more than twenty school systems in the region.

The CLC provides a forum for dialogue and debate about curriculum and assessment through:

- Sharing best practice
- Discussing current research
- Exchanging ideas and resources
