The Master of Science in Criminal Justice **requires 31 credit hours of graduate course work – six core course and five elective courses, which may include concentrations in Corrections and Criminal Justice Administration.** The program is consistent with the dual mission of Bridgewater State College to educate the residents of southeastern Massachusetts and the Commonwealth and to use the College's intellectual, scientific, and technological resources to support and advance the well-being of the region and the state. Specifically, the program *educates* students about the dynamics of crime, criminal behavior, the criminal justice system and how these complex factors interact in recursive relationships with social institutions and public realities.
