Profile of Degree Recipients by Program Level 2008

The overwhelming majority of BSC graduates are Massachusetts residents; only 5 percent of degree recipients are from out of state. Approximately 28 percent of baccalaureate degree recipients are at least 25 years of age; 10 percent are 30 or older. The majority of degree recipients at both the baccalaureate and graduate levels are female; at the graduate level 76 percent are women.

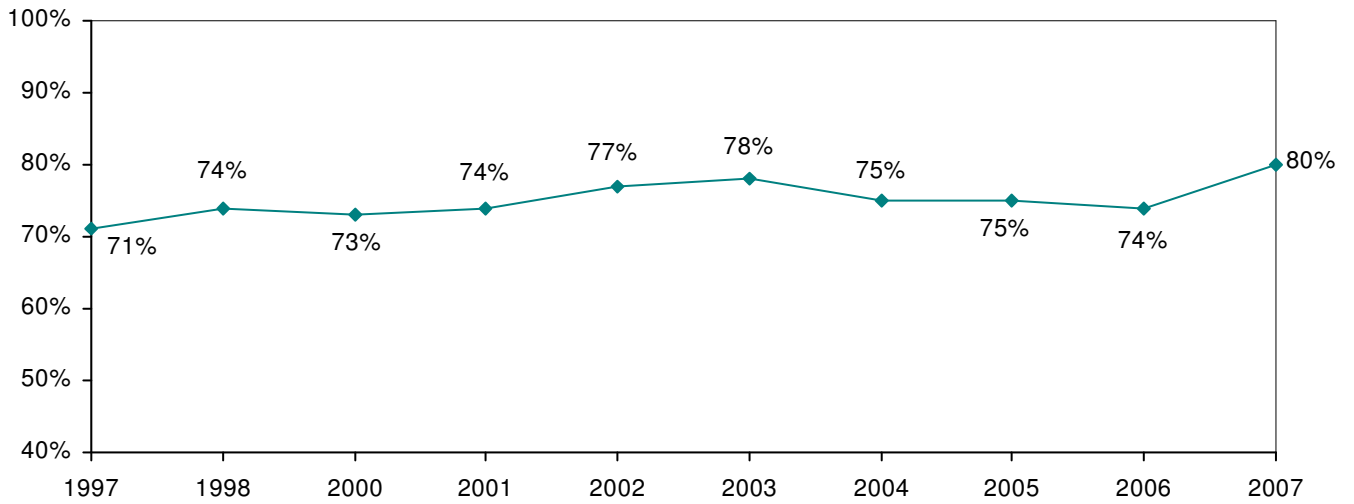

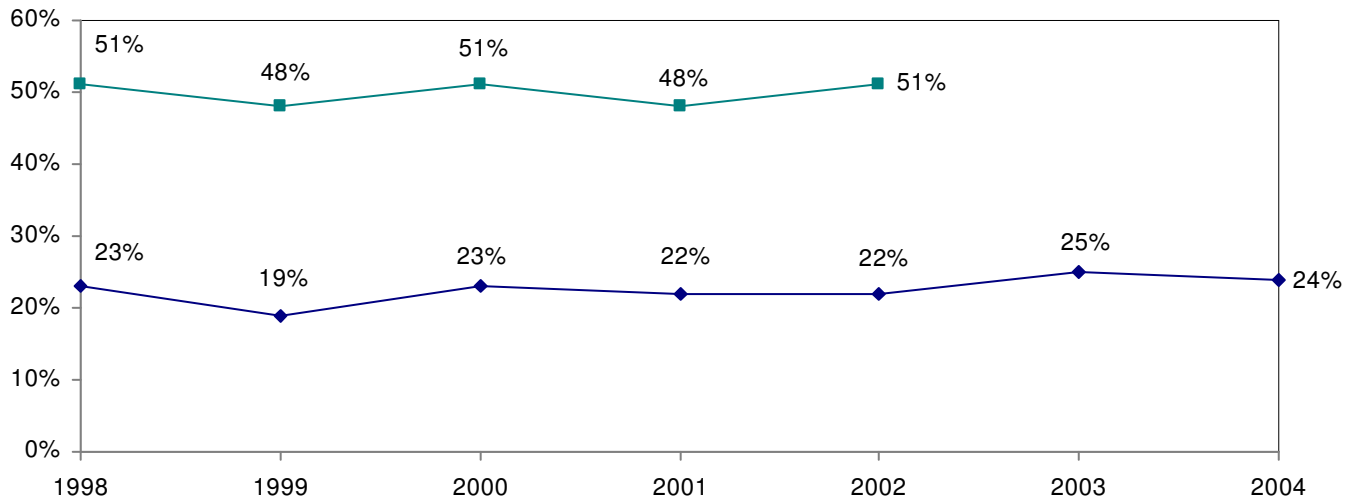
