

UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT REGISTRATION CHECKLIST AND ADVISER CONFERENCE GUIDE

Before you begin, you will need:

- 8-digit Banner ID and 6-digit PIN. (This will ensure access to your InfoBear account and registration.)
NOTE: If you do not remember your PIN you can go to Infobear, click on Registration and Student Information, enter your Banner ID and click on Forgot Pin. Your security question will appear with a box for your answer. When you answer the question correctly you will be prompted to choose a new PIN.
If you continue to have a problem logging on, please contact the Registrar's Office at 508.531.1231 and ask that your PIN be reset.
- Degree audit. (Available on InfoBear with PIN number.)
- Notations from InfoBear of available course sections.
- BSC college catalog (available through INFOBEAR and www.bridgew.edu/Catalog/)

Next Steps:

- Schedule an advising appointment as early as possible.
- Select appropriate courses (and alternatives) according to remaining requirements as identified on the degree audit.
- Complete registration form.
- Prepare questions you wish to discuss with your academic adviser.

Things to bring to adviser meeting:

- Two copies of your printed degree audit.
- Two copies of **completed** registration form.
- List of questions.

Suggested questions for your adviser:

- Are these course selections appropriate for my major and/or core course requirements?
- Does this course schedule take into account my own learning style and ability to meet course load requirements?
- How can I improve my performance in (a designated) class?
- Am I following an appropriate program plan that will prepare me for future course work?
- How do my major courses, core courses and/or elective courses complement my academic goals?
- How do I know this major is right for me?
- How do I pursue my interest in completing a research project?
- What courses will best prepare me for an internship in my field?
- What are the benefits of going to graduate school versus spending time working first?
- What courses are appropriate to take while studying abroad?
- How can I distinguish myself during my academic career so as to best prepare myself for graduate work and my professional career?
- What classes can help me further develop the academic and professional skills that I wish to strengthen? How do I make best use of this opportunity?
