As a member of a multidisciplinary team of dedicated professionals focused on quality care, unity of family and teamwork, the Community Health Social Worker is responsible for the provision of quality clinical social work services to patients and/or families in an individual or group setting. The successful candidate will have demonstrated knowledge of human behavior and theory; and about the psychosocial impact of disease on individuals and families as it relates to their age and stage of development. Additional responsibilities include collaboration with other members of our health care team to ensure patients/caregivers have support systems in place that include transportation, food, and housing.

Additional responsibilities include: developing collaborative relationships with community resources. Participation in multidisciplinary teams and quality initiatives. Provide minimal counseling, only on an interim basis until community linkages are in place. Must have clear written and verbal communication skills. The social worker must understand they are the first-line for patients in distress.

Requirements:

Bilingual (Spanish) fluent is required. Requires a Masters degree in Social Work. (no other degree is accepted) Massachusetts LCSW required, LICSW preferred. A minimum of two years experience in medical or psychiatric social work with preference to experience in medical social work. Experience within a community health center or agency is highly desirable.

Additional responsibilities may include psychosocial research and/or education, as well as collaboration, and/or education, with other members of the health care team. Social worker must have clear written and verbal communication skills. The social worker represents and supports the mission and philosophy of the department.

Provides a comprehensive age-specific, psychosocial assessment of patients, including social, psychological, cultural, environmental and financial information and utilizes this information to develop a psychosocial treatment plan. Incorporates cultural and spiritual variables into the assessment. Able to formulate treatment goals/plans with the client and refer to other disciplines as needed. Supports patients' rights by treating the individual needs in the framework of their specific psychosocial, spiritual, developmental and cultural variables. Provides counseling services to patients and families. Utilizes diverse counseling techniques to help patients and their families deal with their medical situations more effectively. Provides patients and families with information on community resources and appropriately refers patients/families to identified resources. Participates in-patient and family educational efforts. Maintains all appropriate records and follow the department documentation policy. Provides specialized knowledge to other healthcare professionals about psychosocial issues or resources by participating in teaching activities or providing information to colleagues (students, community health fairs, hospital programs or social work department programs.) Assists healthcare providers in understanding the impact of the psychosocial variables. Contributes to development of programs within the social work department or the community (new groups, membership on hospital committees, participation in the revision or development of new programs, community involvement related to patient care or BMC activities).

Requirements: Minimum Masters Degree in Social Work required. Minimum of two years experience in medical or psychiatric social work with preference to experience in medical social work required. LCSW required, LICSW preferred. Bilingual Spanish speaking highly preferred. Experience with and/or knowledge of community and state social and legal services for child abuse victims preferred.

Other Information: A resume is required with on-line application. This is an exempt, 24-hour per week position, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday 8:00 AM - 5:00 PM. Must have MSW with LCSW (minimum) for consideration.
