



Bridgewater State University Office of Testing Services—FAA Written Exams Facts

FAA written exams require each of the following ID inspection items to be present. More than one form of ID may be used.

- ✓ Photograph
- ✓ Date of Birth
- ✓ Date of ID expiry
- ✓ Signature
- ✓ Permanent Address

For US Citizens: Acceptable forms of ID include:

- ✓ Driver’s License
- ✓ Government ID Card
- ✓ Passport
- ✓ Military ID Card

For Resident Aliens: Acceptable forms of ID include:

- ✓ Driver’s License
- ✓ Government ID Card
- ✓ Passport
- ✓ Military ID Card
- ✓ Alien Residency Card

For Non-US citizens and Non-Resident Aliens: Acceptable forms of ID include:

- ✓ Passport—Required for all
- ✓ Driver’s License
- ✓ Government ID Card
- ✓ Military ID Card
- ✓ (Other)

Checklist for your FAA exam:

- ✓ Do you have your instructor endorsement (and other supporting documents) if needed?
- ✓ Have you met the ID requirements?
- ✓ Ready to pay your exam fee?
- ✓ Do you have your approved instruments?
- ✓ Have you studied sufficiently?
- ✓ Is your 141 Certificate of Graduation less than 60 days old?

Other facts:

- ✓ FAA Written results are valid for two years after the exam.
- ✓ Retests after a “Fail” require an additional instructor endorsement.
- ✓ Retests for a higher score require a 30-day wait.
- ✓ FAA exams cost \$150—no discount for retests.
- ✓ A \$10 discount is available for AOPA members if you register directly with PSI/LaserGrade. 800-211-2754
- ✓ All Airmen regulations are available online at FAA.gov
- ✓ You are required by the FAA to sign-in and sign-out, use your full name and properly record your exam times.
