

## BRIDGEWATER STATE UNIVERSITY TRANSFER CHECKLIST

### □ Application Deadlines

- Fall Admissions Application Deadline is August 1st
- Spring Admissions Application Deadline is November 1st
- Applications after the deadline will be accepted on a first-come-first-serve basis.

### □ Eligibility

- To be eligible for admission, transfer students must have earned one of the following:
  - Between 12 and 23 transferable college credits with a 2.5 college grade point average or
  - 24 or more transferable college credits with a 2.0 grade point average

**Please note that these are merely minimum grade point averages and do not guarantee admission.**

- Second Degree Option: You may be admitted to the university to pursue an additional bachelor's degree in a field of study substantially different from your initial degree program if you have earned a bachelor's degree at Bridgewater State University or at another accredited institution. More information on completing a second bachelor's degree can be found in the university catalog under Undergraduate Admissions.

### □ Apply

- Submit a transfer application online. Visit <http://www.bridgew.edu/admissions/undergraduate/apply>
- Students transferring 24 or more credits need to only submit their transfer application and transcript(s).
- Students transferring 23 or fewer credits must submit their high school transcripts, SAT scores and an essay.
- Transfer students are not required to in for a formal interview.

### □ Submit Transcript(s)

- Send your academic transcript(s) to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions, Welcome Center, 45 Plymouth Street, Bridgewater, MA 02325
- If you do not hear from the Office of Admissions in a reasonable amount of time, contact them at 508-531-1237 to be sure all of your materials have been received. Your application must be complete before it will be reviewed.
- You must submit transcript(s) from each institution you have attended, **in a signed/sealed envelope**, even if you do not think the transcripts are relevant to your application. Failure to do so could result in lost transfer credits. If you are currently enrolled, send a transcript now showing the courses you are enrolled in. Be sure to request your final transcript once you have completed your last semester. This will not happen automatically – only you can authorize the release of your transcript(s).
- Bridgewater State University is very liberal in the number of transfer credits they accept from other institutions; 69 credits from a two-year institution and 90 credits from a four-year institution.

### □ Financial Aid

- The FAFSA Priority Deadline is **March 1st**. Visit <http://www.fafsa.ed.gov>
- Students may apply after the priority date, however aid will be awarded on a funds-available basis.
- If you have already applied for FAFSA, it is your responsibility to contact Federal Government and give them Bridgewater's Federal School code: **002183**

### □ Tour

- Schedule a tour of the campus. The Office of Admissions runs tours Monday – Friday. Sign-up for one today!

### □ Next Steps

- Upon acceptance, return your deposit to secure your place at BSU.
